- 5. Cyfrifon:** Cyflwynodd y Trysorydd ei Adroddiad am y flwyddyn a mynegodd ei ddiolch i Nereus yn y Bala am ei waith yn paratoi'r fantolen. Cyfeiriodd at y ffaith bod cynnydd yn yr arian aelodaeth a ddaeth i law, diolch i ymdrechion yr Ysgrifennydd Aelodaeth. Yn anffodus mae llogau wedi gostwng. Nododd bod gwerthiant ôl-rifynnau'r *Cylchgrawn* a'r Mynegai wedi cynyddu. MERIONETHSHIRE HISTORICAL AND RECORDS SOCIETY

Minutes of the Council Meeting

held on Saturday, 10 October 2015 at Llanelltud Village Hall.

PRESENT: The Chairman; Arwyn Lloyd Hughes; Gruffydd Aled Williams; Rhian Parry; Rheinallt Llwyd; Colin Thomas; Megan Huggins; Catherine James; Pamela J Michael; Pegi Lloyd-Williams; Buddug Medi; The Secretary.

1. **WELCOME:** The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting.
2. **MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING:** The Minutes were accepted.
3. **MATTERS ARISING:** There were no matters arising that were not on the agenda.
4. **CORRESPONDENCE:** The following correspondence was referred to –
 - i) Message from A L Darbyshire recommending that the Society should look to the future.
 - ii) Letter from Hugh G Roberts emphasising the importance of digital media and encouraging young people to join the Society.
5. **ACCOUNTS:** The Treasurer gave his Report for the year and expressed his gratitude to Nereus of Bala for preparing the balance sheet. He referred to the fact that subscriptions had increased, thanks to the efforts of the Membership Secretary. Unfortunately, interest rates have decreased. He referred to the fact that sales of previous issues of the *Journal* and Index have increased. Gift Aid was discussed and the fact that the Society had received it in the past but that the rules have now changed, and as the *Journal* is worth more than the 'Benefits for Donors' threshold we cannot now claim it. It was noted that the Cadw grant we have received has now come to an end. Reference was made to the Heritage Lottery Grant that has given the Society's finances and activities a boost. In explaining expenditure, it was observed that printing costs have remained constant, but that there were increases in design costs and that we had paid for copying materials to the National Library of Wales. It was highlighted that postage costs are still increasing and that e-mail should be used as much as possible. To close the Treasurer noted that there was a deficit for the year. He expressed his gratitude to the Auditor, Peter Jones for his work. The Chairman expressed our appreciation of the Treasurer's work on our behalf and for his report and asked for any comments from the floor. It was asked if we could possibly revert to the old method of distributing the *Journal* by hand. It was agreed that this could save costs and ways of progressing should be considered.
6. **THE ANNUAL REPORT:** Council Members' attention was drawn to the report. It was decided to recommend that the AGM should accept the report.
7. **MEMBERSHIP:** The Membership Secretary referred to her report in the Annual Report and the concern that the number of institutions in Wales that subscribe is decreasing. It was encouraging to see a number of new members had joined. The Chairman thanked the Secretary for her work although she faced severe difficulties and noted her intention to resign from the post during the year.
8. **THE JOURNAL:** The Editor also referred to the Annual Report noting that the *Journal* is with the printers at present. He expressed his gratitude to all the contributors for their reliability and noted that he had several articles lined up for the next issue. The Chairman expressed our appreciation of the Editor's work and the work of Aeron Jones and the Printers in Welshpool for their work.
9. **MEETINGS:** The Meetings Organiser gave her report explaining that we had varied a little from the usual routine this year. A meeting was arranged at Llanbedr to commemorate D J Williams and to launch a memoir, 7 workshops were held at the Record Office to discuss the First World War and its impact locally and the contact made with Wales

for Peace. It was also mentioned that the new website gives us a new method of communication. A brief outline of suggestions for the next year was given. The Chairman thanked the Organiser and noted that the programme for the next year was very promising.

10. **HISTORY OF MERIONETH:** The Chairman outlined the situation at present to members. It was explained that the Trustees were very concerned about the situation and had decided, due to uncertainty regarding the progress made and when the volume would be complete, along with the associated financial concerns, that they recommend that the project should be abandoned. Understandably Neil Evans and Nia Watkin Powell were very disappointed with this decision, and both had expressed their feelings clearly. The President proceeded to give the background to the decision mentioning the fact that the process of taking such a volume through the press is a very lengthy process, as was seen with the previous volumes. The prospective contributors present were asked if they had anything to add. Those present expressed their feeling that they had no contact with the editors for some time to discuss their contributions. It was stated that 10 years had passed since the work on the volume had been initiated and that there was concern that not enough progress had been seen. It was decided that it should be recommended to the Annual General Meeting that this project should be abandoned.

11. **WEBSITE:** The website is now live. Concern was expressed that a Google search leads to the old website. It was decided we should contact Llyr Edwards to ask him to look into this.

- iii) **Gwynedd Council** – concern was expressed regarding the intended cuts in the Council and that they are consulting on these until 10 November and it was recommended that the members should respond on-line and that a letter should also be sent on behalf of the Society.

14. **CLOSE:** The Chairman brought proceeding to a close and expressed his appreciation for the support of the members present and the fluency of the discussions.
